THE MOTHER'S DAY

The second Sunday in May is observed as the Mother's Day to honor all mothers. It began in its present form with a special service in May, 1907 at the Andrews Methodist Episcopal Church in Grafton, West Virginia. The service was organized by a Methodist laywoman, Anna Jarvis, to honor her mother who died on May 9, 1905. Many people came to the memorial service. The touching atmosphere made her feel that not only her mother deserved such an honor but all mothers should. She wrote, 'Mother suffers the most while she receives the least.'


So, Anna wrote a lot of letters to different people urging the need for the country to have a special national day for the mothers. By 1908 Anna Jarvis advocated that all mothers be honored on the second Sunday in May, and in 1912 the Methodist Episcopal Church recognized the day and raised it to the national agenda. In 1915, the President Wilson proclaimed the second Sunday in May to be the Mother's Day.

The observer of this day who has a living mother to honor is truly fortunate, for the opportunity still remains to him to speak the word of endearment and appreciation and pride which is the only thing she covets.

The observer of this day who has only the memory of a mother can know the richness and beauty and comfort of it by calling back the memory and cherishing it, which fulfills the faith of the one who gave him life.
